Minimum level of NGB coaching qualification for coaches employed through the Community Sports Coach Scheme	1 <sup>st</sup> 4Sport Level 2 in Coaching Football or PE Teacher with 1 <sup>st</sup> 4Sport Level 1 in Coaching Football with a commitment to achieving Level 2 within 12 months. All coaches to attend Soccability /Coaching Disabled Footballers Course to ensure they are able to include all young people in within their coaching session
