<p>NGB deployment focus for the Community Sports Coaches linked to NGB player pathway and relevant development initiatives.</p>	<p>The British Judo Association is in the middle of the Long-Term Athlete Development Planning (LTADP) exercise, led by Dr Lisa McIver and Istvan Balyi. The planning phase will be completed in October 2003 with a rollout over the following 6-8 months.</p> <p>We are also in the process of assuming the operations of the British Schools Judo Association – so we will have amore direct channel into the schools.</p> <p>We would see the Community Sports Coach Scheme targeting the critical 10-14 age group (10-12 Judo Skills, and 12-14 Learning to Train), primarily in schools with a view to directly linking this development work to specific clubs.</p>
