General Comments

- Sounds an interesting idea and something that would make good sense for existing personnel in our area
- We need political support for this to make a formal alignment with our Local Strategic Partnership
- The area we work and live in means that the opportunities to follow some of the work that Great Yarmouth has developed
- It would make good sense to work alongside areas like Great Yarmouth in sharing information and perhaps on some joint projects given our location.
- We could make better use of our natural coastline in developing activities
- Engaging the voluntary sector clubs and organisations is important.
- We need to use our local sportsmen and women to help raise the profile of this
- Capacity could be an issue for driving this, particularly early on and we will need support from the CSP in helping with administration, consultation and pulling together the action plan. Long term we need to review who does what.
- We need to review what is currently going on as it may not be a case of setting up lots of new initiatives but making sure people are aware of what is available and making the most of what we have already.
- We need support in realigning work programmes to enable time to be freed to commit to making this work.
- Networking with other CSNs in this county will be important to see what ideas people have and what barriers to delivery people are coming up against
- Sustaining what we do already is an issue so I can see some issues with setting up new projects in terms of capacity.
