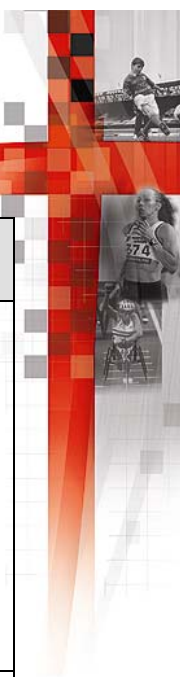

Participation CPA 2006	% of adults (16 years and over) participating in at least 30 minutes of moderate intensity sport and active recreation (including recreational walking) on 3 or more days a week	The Active People Survey every 3 yrs (collection, analysis and publication of data is currently being undertaken by Ipsos MORI on behalf of Sport England)	The Active People Survey has been commissioned by Sport England. The survey commenced on 15 October 2005 and will continue for a year using a phone survey of 1,000 people in each local authority area. Results of this survey will provide the PI's for Adult Participation and Volunteering. You will not need to do anything other than continue to encourage your residents to participate and volunteer in sport. It will also provide lots of other useful information to assist you in your local planning. The 'Active People Diagnostic' will be available from November 2006 providing an innovative, online reporting system where all the results and data from the survey will be placed. Thresholds for BVPI 119 are based on 25th and 75th percentile points (based on all council types with available data) and these are issued by the Audit Commission
