

Roles

Community Sports Coach Scheme

- Co-ordinate the scheme at a sub-regional level, across 31 sports, SSPs, local authorities and other local partners, to:
 - produce funding submissions to the Regional Sports Boards for the employment of full/part-time coaches based on a strategic needs analysis and robust consultation process;
 - investigate and secure, where appropriate, local sources of matched funding;
 - ensure all employing bodies operate to quality standards for the recruitment, employment, management and development of coaches;
 - co-ordinate/provide managed, quality continuous professional development support for employed coaches;
 - act as the strategic co-ordinating agency for the DfES funded CSCs (and other funding sources if secured) to identify need, determine best solution for employment and to look at the on-going support and development of coaches;
 - provide monitoring information as required;
 - ensure the scheme is linked to other coach workforce development initiatives at a sub-regional level.

Step into Sport

- Develop and implement volunteer strategies to support clubs and volunteers
- Provide quality volunteer placement opportunities for the young community volunteers identified by the SSPs
- Organise community volunteering one day conferences for the Community Volunteers, in conjunction with the SSP and NGBs
- To provide NGBs with details of clubs that are providing placements for young volunteers

School Club Links

- Play a major role in achieving the PESSCL target of increasing the proportion of young people guided into clubs from School Sports Partnerships by:
 - the interface between the SSPs and the NGBs for 22 sports (Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Canoeing, Cricket, Cycling, Football, Golf, Gymnastics, Hockey, Judo, Netball, Orienteering, Rowing, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Sailing, Squash, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis and Volleyball)
 - Advising on the positioning and delivery of multi-skill clubs to ensure effective player pathways and links with other sports development programmes
 - Co-ordinating local delivery for sports outside the 22 directly funded sports
