## Planning Applications Affecting Playing Fields – Regional Breakdown 2016-17

### **East**

- 160 out of 162 (99%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 2 (1%)

#### **East Midlands**

- 98 out of 105 (93%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 7 (7%)

#### London

- 78 out of 93 (84%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 15 (16%)

#### **North East**

- 59 out of 62 (95%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 3 (5%)

### **North West**

- 134 out of 142 (94%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 8 (6%)

### **South East**

- 210 out of 237 (89%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 27 (11%)

## **South West**

- 114 out of 124 (92%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 10 (8%).

## **West Midlands**

- 119 out of 125 (95%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 6 (5%)

# Yorkshire

- 130 out of 137 (95%) concluded planning applications affecting playing fields resulted in improved or safeguarded sports provision
- Despite formal objections from Sport England, the number of applications which led to a detrimental impact on sport was 7 (5%)
